## Certificate of Adequacy for Reception Facilities

from oceangoing ships, as required by the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships, 1973, as modified by the Protocol of 1978 (MARPOL 73/78), The Act to Prevent Pollution from Ships, 33 USC 1901-1912 and associated U.S. Regulations in 33 CFR 158.

This certificate is issued pursuant to an application dated February 21, 2023 and an inspection dated March 9, 2023, copies of which are attached, and part of this certificate. Each terminal listed in the application shall maintain a copy of this certificate available for inspection by Coast Guard personnel and the master, operator, agent, or owner of any ship using or intending to use this terminal

Terminals and ports required to have an operations manual for oil transfer described in 33 CFR 154.300 shall attach a copy of this certificate thereto.

The terminal/port person in charge identified in the attached application shall notify the U.S. Coast Guard Captain of the Port (COTP) in writing after any of the reception facility information or terminal/port information identified in 33 CFR 158.165 changes.

The terminal/port owner, operator, or person in charge are liable for civil penalties of up to \$25,000 for violations of the provisions of 33 CFR 158.

The terminal/port owner, operator, or person in charge shall ensure that the reception facility holds each state, local, and federal permit and license required by environmental laws and regulations concerning garbage, residues and mixtures containing oil or noxious liquid substances. This certificate certifies compliance with applicable sections of 33 CFR 158, but does not certify compliance with any other law or regulation.

This certificate is valid for a period of 5 years from the date issuance; or until suspended or revoked; or until 30 days after the operator cited on the certificate changes; at which time it shall be promptly returned to the U.S. Coast Guard COTP.

Enclosed is a Certificate of Adequacy for Oil and Garbage. Based upon the information you provided, you attest that your facility meets the requirements of Title 33, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 158. This means your facility is capable of receiving a minimum of 160 metric tons of oily mixtures from an oceangoing ship within 24 hours after notice by that ship, is capable of completing the reception of oily mixtures in less than 4 hours after the transfer operation begins and is capable of receiving all operational waste (garbage) from an oceangoing ship. More specific details and additional requirements pertaining to your facility can be found in 33 CFR Part 158.

The United States has an obligation under MARPOL to remove all unreasonable barriers to ships' ability to properly discharge waste. Failure to comply with these regulations may result in suspension, revocation and/or termination of the facility Certificate of Adequacy. If you believe that a requirement in 33 CFR Part 158 is unreasonable or impracticable for your facility operations, you may submit a request for a waiver. The application for a waiver must be in writing, include the reasons why the requirement is unreasonable or impracticable, propose alternatives to meet MARPOL 73/78 and include any other additional requested information to help evaluate the request.

If your facility cannot meet the above requirements and any other obligations under 33 CFR Part 158; your facility cannot comply with a ship's request for any reason, even in situations where the ship has declined reception services due to cost; and/or you have any questions about the contents of this letter or any other requirement, please contact my Facility Inspections Branch immediately at (718) 354-4286.

The enclosed certificate must be retained in your files and made available for Coast Guard review. Details of your facility's waste reception capabilities will be listed on the U.S. Coast Guard Maritime Information Exchange ([cgmix.uscg.mil](http://cgmix.uscg.mil)) and available to the public.
